PREFACE

If you've ever heard a message by Adrian Rogers, then you are keenly aware of his quick wit. He was always ready with a quip, an anecdote, or a whimsical poem. He loved alliterations, and certainly could turn a phrase with the best of them. He was a master of the language. His wit was disarming, and it was endearing.

Yet in addition to his wit, Adrian Rogers also possessed exceptional wisdom. He had a way of taking common things and saying them in such an uncommon way so as to make you think through them all over again. And conversely, he could take uncommon things and put them in unusually common terms.

But neither his wit nor his wisdom ever overpowered the message of the Gospel; rather, it complemented it—just little snippets sprinkled in to season the message. They were a tool—a gift—he used to effectively tell others of Jesus, to break down barriers, to bring the point from an intellectual level to a personal one, and to diffuse even the most antagonistic arguments.

While many of the remarks are entirely original and were coined by Adrian Rogers, he was also widely read and picked up countless sayings, expressions, and stories from others' writings. He gathered rhymes, jingles, and expressions from as far back as childhood, and it appears he never forgot a single one. It would be impossible for us to trace all of these back to their sources, so we readily admit that although many are not original, they were appreciated by Dr. Rogers and employed in his own unique way. Over the years they have become identifiable with, almost inseparable from, him. They have become "Adrianisms."
